

Black-throated Blue Warbler

Dendroica caerulescens



About this Bird

The Black-throated Blue Warbler arrives in the Caribbean from Canada and the US by mid-October and does not leave again until April. The males and females look so different that they were once thought to be different species! The male is slate-blue above with black face, throat and sides. The female is greenish-grey above and light tan below, with a white stripe above the eye and white arc below. Black-throated Blue Warblers can be seen in gardens, shade coffee plantations, woodlands and forests. In winter they eat a lot of fruit as well as insects. *Bird Size 13 cm, 5.25 in.*
