#### Day 1: Arrival in Bogotá

- Arrive at Dorado International Airport (BOG) by 2:00 p.m.
- Transfer to City Express Plus Hotel.
- Rest and acclimatize to the altitude (2,600 m / 8,530 ft).

#### Day 2: Transfer to Leticia, Amazonas

Morning transfer to the airport for a flight to Leticia. Leticia is a vibrant city located in the southern part of Colombia, near the borders with Brazil and Peru. It serves as the capital of the Amazonas department and is situated along the Amazon River, making it a key gateway to the Amazon rainforest. Leticia is surrounded by lush rainforest, home to an incredible variety of wildlife, including countless bird species, monkeys, and exotic plants. It's a prime spot for ecotourism and birdwatching. #### Day 3: Kilometer 17 Road

Common sightings include the Scarlet Macaw, Slate-colored Hawk, Amazonian Trogon, Hoatzin, Kingfishers, and many Hummingbirds species. The lagoon and its surroundings feature a mix of wetlands, flooded forests, and riverside habitats, which attract a wide range of birds. This variety makes it an ideal spot for birdwatching throughout the year. Birdwatching at Tarapoto Lagoon offers a peaceful and immersive experience in the heart of the Amazon rainforest. In addition to endemics, we can expect to see a range of other species, including **Andean Teal**, **Bronze-tailed Thornbill**, and various types of **Tyrant Flycatchers**. The dramatic landscapes of Sumapaz Páramo, with its rolling hills, misty moorlands, and vibrant flora, provide a beautiful backdrop for birdwatching and photography.

Birding in Sumapaz Páramo offers a unique opportunity to explore one of Colombia's most important ecosystems. Whether you're an avid birder or simply interested in the natural beauty of the region, the páramo provides a memorable experience filled with rich biodiversity and stunning landscapes.

Notable birds include the Muisca Antpitta, Longuemare's Sunangel, and Blue-throated Starfrontlet. Chingaza National Park features diverse ecosystems, including high-altitude páramo, cloud forests, and montane forests.
