ITINERARY

Day 1 Arrival to Cartagena

Arrival day to Colombia, this will be the day of arrival in the country, you will be picked up at the Rafael Nuñez International Airport, check in at the hotel and meet our Bird Guide.

Cartagena, located on the shores of the Caribbean Sea, is renowned for its charming, colorful streets and serves as the gateway to South America. Situated in northern Colombia, it is the capital of the Bolívar region. Often referred to as "La Heroica," the city is surrounded by several archipelagos and islands, offering serene spots for relaxation.

In addition to its stunning landscapes, Cartagena boasts a vibrant nightlife, cultural festivals, and inviting beaches that are perfect for sightseeing and enjoying the refreshing sea breeze. Recognized as one of the most beautiful and well-preserved cities in the Americas, Cartagena de Indias is a treasure and a top tourist destination in Colombia.

Day 2 Agricola Las Camelias Reserve – City Tour

The reserve is home to over 200 confirmed bird species spread across 40 hectares of tropical dry forest. We will leave the hotel at 5:00 AM and spend the morning there until 11:00 AM. During our visit, we can expect to see a variety of birds, including the Crested Bobwhite, Groove-billed Ani, Rufous-breasted Hermit, Red-billed Emerald, Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl, Rufous-tailed Jacamar, Spot-breasted Woodpecker, Turquoise-winged Parrotlet, Black-crested Antshrike, Lance-tailed Manakin, Lesser Kiskadee, Hooded Tanager, Pale-eyed Pygmy-Tyrant, Yellow Tyrannulet, Stripe-backed Wren, and Ruby-topaz Hummingbird, among others, We will return at the hotel for lunch and then go to the walled city to take a tour of its streets, visit the San Felipe castle, its colonial streets, A beautiful journey with the best memories.

Day 3 Mangrove

On this day, we will explore a mangrove area, where we'll observe the diverse birds and mammals that inhabit these ecosystems. We'll also take the opportunity to enjoy some of the beautiful beaches that surround Cartagena, possible species: Brown-throated Parakeet, Yellow Oriole, Orange-chinned Parakeet, Spot-breasted Woodpecker, Stripe-backed Wren, Turquoise-winged Parrotlet, Blue Ground Dove, Buff-necked Ibis, among other, then we'll to return at the hotel for lunch and then go to Barranquilla city.

Day 4 Salamanca Island Park

The Cienega Grande de Santa Marta is a brackish water lagoon, formed in low lands and continuous with the ocean. Its stability depends mainly on the balance between the fresh water that enters through the system of lagoons interconnected by pipes, the Magdalena River, the different rivers that descend from the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta and the salt water coming from the Caribbean Sea; Salamanca Island Park is a Protected Area of the national order of the System of National Natural Parks of Colombia, we will be there until noon, we will have lunch at a typical food restaurant on the way, Possible species: Pied Puffbird, Yellow-chinned Spinetail, Chestnut Piculet, Northern Scrub-Flycatcher, Bicolored Conebill, Northern Screamer, Sapphire-bellied Hummingbird, Snail Kite, Cattle Tyrant, White-headed Marsh Tyrant, among others. Then we will transfer to the hotel located near Tayrona Park.

Day 5 Tayrona National Natural Park

The foothills of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, the highest coastal mountain range in the world, extend into the sea like the fingers of a gigantic hand, creating stunning bays and inlets such as Chengue, Gayraca, Cinto, Neguanje, Concha, and Guachaquita. These areas feature white sand beaches bordered by mangroves, scrub, and forests, all surrounded by the crystalline waters of the Caribbean Sea. This breathtaking landscape is part of the many attractions offered by Tayrona National Natural Park.

After breakfast, we will head to the park, where we'll search for some of the more than 400 species of birds found in the area, including the Crested Guan, Lesser Scaup, Whooping Motmot, Crimsoncrested Woodpecker, Pale-bellied Hermit, Orange-crowned Oriole, Crested Oropendola, Rufousnecked Wood-Rail, among others. We will enjoy lunch inside the park and then we will leave the park heading to Minca

Day 6 Minca and surroundings

We will gradually ascend toward the Sierra Nevada after breakfast, embarking on our journey to seek out the region's endemic species. Lunch will be enjoyed at a location surrounded by bird feeders, providing excellent viewing opportunities. We will then continue our journey to the Mountain House Lodge, one of the most significant centers of continental endemism in the world. This historic site was also where Melbourne Armstrong Carriker, an American entomologist and ornithologist, conducted research through a series of expeditions to various altitudes in the early 20th century. His work led to the collection of bird specimens for several museums in the United States and resulted in the publication of *The Birds of the Santa Marta Region of Colombia*.

On the way to the lodge, we can expect to encounter a variety of species, including the Santa Marta Woodstar (E), Blue-naped Chlorophonia, Santa Marta Blossomcrown (E), Slate-throated Redstart, Tyrian Metaltail, Plumbeous Kite, Scaled Piculet, Ruddy Woodcreeper, Olive-gray Saltator, Bicolored Wren, Keel-billed Toucan, Crane Hawk, Strong-billed Woodcreeper, Streak-capped Spinetail, Graythroated Leaftosser, Band-tailed Guan, Black-banded Woodcreeper, and White-necked Jacobin, among others.

Day 7 San Lorenzo Ridge

On this day, we will depart at 4:30 AM for the upper reaches of the mountain range. Our main objective is to search for the Santa Marta Parakeet (E), Santa Marta Antpitta (E), Sierra Nevada

Antpitta (E), Santa Marta Tapaculo (E), Golden-breasted Fruiteater, Northern Mouse-colored Tyrannulet, Black-backed Thornbill, White-tailed Starfrontlet, Black-cheeked Mountain Tanager (E), White-tipped Quetzal, and others. It is believed that there are fewer than 100 individuals of some species remaining in the entire mountain range, making them extremely vulnerable. We may have the rare opportunity to be among the last to see these magnificent birds in the wild.

We'll also have chances to find areas with bird feeders, enhancing our birdwatching experience. The views of the mountain range and its snow-capped peaks will be breathtaking. After returning to the reserve for lunch, we will spend the afternoon exploring the surrounding areas for more birdwatching opportunities.

Day 8 Minca-Riohacha

Descend to the lower part of Minca and we continue to Riohacha, after breakfast we will take the tour stopping at some points to look for additional species, we will have lunch on the way and in the afternoon, we will arrive at the hotel, Riohacha, the capital of La Guajira, is one of the best kept secrets of the Greater Colombian Caribbean. Here you will discover long, unspoiled beaches, vibrant nature reserves and rich indigenous traditions, and you can also buy handcrafted products made by the talented women of the Wayú indigenous community.

Day 9 Los Flamencos Flora and Fauna Sanctuary

Birdwatching and photography will take place at the Los Flamencos Flora and Fauna Sanctuary in Camarones, a charming town about an hour and a half away. During the tour of the Sanctuary, you'll be guided to the best spots for birdwatching, including a special area for closely observing the Vermilion Cardinal. You'll also have the chance to see beautiful American Flamingos and various other species, such as the Dark-billed Cuckoo, Ruby-topaz Hummingbird, Double-striped Thick-knee, Chestnut Piculet, Gray-capped Cuckoo, Mangrove Rail, Peregrine Falcon, Scarlet Ibis, White Ibis, Reddish Egret, and Great-tailed Grackle.

While at the Sanctuary, you'll enjoy lunch near the beach and have opportunities to observe shorebirds and more. In the afternoon, we'll immerse ourselves in the cultural richness of the Wayú community with a special exhibition showcasing their traditions, we will finish the activity and you will have the opportunity to enjoy the beach a little before going to the hotel.

Day 10 Flight to Bogotá

In the morning we will fly to Bogota, and in the afternoon we will visit the Monserrate hill, an iconic place in the city, It's a high mountain that dominates the city centre of Bogotá and is at an altitude

of 3,152 m.a.s.l or 10341 ft, where there is a church with a shrine, devoted to El Señor Caido ("The Fallen Lord") we will go up by means of a funicular, a type of steep angled climbing train, that will take us to the ecological path, it is a 360-meter-long area designed for birdwatching and photography, and the contemplation of nature. Located at the top of Monserrate, you can observe a variety of birds typical of the High Andean Forest ecosystem, among them, more than ten species of hummingbirds and other species of birds, typical of the American continent. Due to its easer of access and its flat terrain, it makes the route easy to traverse; in the same breath, the best conditions of security, attention and service are provided. More than 100 species of birds have been recorded, the place has fruit feeders, nectar feeders, seed feeders, which attracts species as interesting to see as the Sword billed hummingbird, Blue-throated Starfrontlet, Longuemare's Sunangel , Tyrian Metaltail, Glossy Flowerpiercer, Slaty Brushfinch, Golden-fronted Redstart, Green-tailed Trainbearer, Pale-naped Brushfinch, Mountain Velvet Breast, White bellied Woodstar, Purple-backed Thornbill, Coppery-bellied Puffleg among others, birds that you can easily see and photograph.
